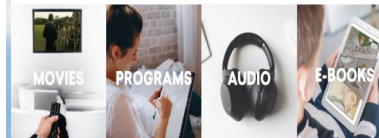



**Pastors Corner:**

Dear St. Mary's Parishioners, Monday was a big day and I will share some thoughts of the first 24 hours. Fr. Buhman and Fr. Kain were moving out and Fr. Schukei and I were moving in. Fr. Ventre had his things moving into the garage and our kind seminarian Ranil was helping. I first moved into this rectory in 1993 as assistant pastor under my friend and mentor Msgr. Adrian Herbek and now I am back 30 years later as Pastor. I am happy to be back but still trying to get settled (not an easy job).
