# Led by the Church's Chief Missionary

This will be the first World Mission Sunday under Pope Leo XIV, the first pope from the United States and the first in modern times to have spent most of his priestly life as a missionary. His pastoral experience in Peru gives weight to his words when, on May 22, 2025, he described the Pontifical Mission Societies as "the primary means for awakening missionary responsibility among all the baptized [and for] supporting ecclesial communities in areas where the Church is young."

We see this mission expressed in the work of the four Pontifical Mission Societies:

- The Society for the Propagation of the Faith, which provides pastoral support, catechesis, church construction, healthcare, and education.
- The Missionary Childhood Association (Holy Childhood), which supports faith formation and care for the needs and protection of children.
- The Society of Saint Peter the Apostle, which supports vocations to the priesthood and religious life in the missions.
- The Pontifical Missionary Union, which forms clergy, religious, and lay faithful for missionary discipleship.

## **More Than a Collection**

World Mission Sunday is not just a second collection. It is the Church's annual call to put the missions and evangelization at the center of our life and parish communities. It reminds us that every Catholic is by baptism, a missionary disciple, and that our own nation was once mission territory, sustained by the very collection we now have the privilege to support.

Let us respond — together with each other and with Pope Leo — as Missionaries of Hope among the Peoples.



### PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear St Mary and Assumption Parishioners.

Last week, I wrote about my personal experience with the Cursillo retreat movement. I went on my first Cursillo in 1990 and have probably been on another 15 since then. Cursillo is a four day retreat held generally in a Parish Hall or gymnasium. There are men's weekends and then the women's weekends. I have attended at least five in David City.

The SINE retreat (systematic, integral, new, evangelization) began in Mexico City with Fr. Navarro in 1972. In 1996, Bishop Bruskewitz said that all parishes must have an evangelization effort. By march of 1999, 32 parishes in our diocese, 39 priests and 1424 laypeople had made a SINE retreat. The Lincoln Diocese was the fastest growing area for SINE in the whole world.

SINE had three components. 1) Fundamental Evangelization (Kerygma) 2) Follow up to form disciples and apostles 3) Social transformation because we have disciples and apostles.

New evangelization refers to our relationship with Jesus. It does not mean a new message. The New evangelization term comes from St. Pope John Paul II. In 1983, in Haiti, Pope JPII first made mention of what he calls the "new evangelization". He urged the clergy and laity alike to evangelize to spread the Good News, with new fervor, new expression, and new methods. The pope had reminded us that evangelization has always been and continues to be the mission of the Church.

SINE was a three day retreat experience with follow up groups, similar to Cursillo. In David City, there were three SINE retreats in 1998, one in 1999, two in 2000 and three in 2001 with the third one being offered for the faculty and staff at Aquinas and St Mary's, held in Brainard. Many Cursillos were also held in David City during these vears and after.

When I went to North American Martyrs Church in Lincoln, in 2008, I quickly heard about Light of the World retreats. This was another retreat that evolved from SINE in our diocese. We had about one retreat each year at NAM until Covid shut us down. It was a real blessing for the parish.

So, I am working with Sr. Mary and the head of LOTW to have a retreat held here during Lent on Friday March 13-15, 2026. I am very excited to have a team come from another parish and offer the first retreat. Those retreatants will then put on the next retreat here in David City.

I have continually seen how powerful a parish-based retreat is on the life of the retreatants and the parish. It is nice that people can sleep in their own homes and devote a Friday night and all of Saturday and Sunday to the retreat alongside other parishioners. Please pray for the success and think about whether God is calling you at this time in your life.
