Pastor’s Corner

Dear St. Mary / Assumption Parishioners,

On Saturday morning and at the Vigil we will celebrate Sts. Peter and Paul, as this Solemnity trumps the 13th Sunday of Ordinary Time. They were both martyrs. The fisherman who was close to Christ, in spite of his failings, led the Church as the first pope and clear leader of the nascent Church. Jesus said, “upon this rock, I will build my church and the gates of hell with not prevail.” The Church remains our rock, despite sin and failings over the 2,000 years. Paul, the former Pharisee, followed the mandate of Christ “to go forth and Baptize... teaching them all I have commanded you...” as the zealous apostle to the gentiles. His letters to the early Church communities inspired them and us as we know he suffered as he was flogged, beaten, stoned, shipwrecked, and attacked by brigands. St. Mary’s church has these two leaders of our faith carved in marble on the front of our façade and in the main high altar. St. Peter with the keys to the kingdom and St. Paul with the sword, by which he gave his blood. They are our heroes, our saints and fearless patrons who have gone before us. Sts. Peter and Paul, pray for us.

Last week, give yourself an A+ in math if you were bewildered by the numbers in our bulletin under weekly stewardship. With Totus Tuus going on, our routine was bit out of sync, and I saw them Friday night and thought, “oh no, that’s way off” while wishing it was correct. Our giving had been about \$73K behind, we were \$6K short again and so I was thinking we should then be \$79K behind. However, it was showing only \$36K behind. Somehow, we picked up \$43K. The discrepancy was due to the recent grain contributions we have received, that had inadvertently been excluded from our Sunday collection figures. Hoo-ray! I started doing backflips and summersaults in celebration! Mystery solved in our favor. An honest mistake. Further good news is we had a good Sunday collection this past weekend to further bring our numbers down. Praise God and THANK YOU ALL for your good stewardship. I am so happy that we have closed the gap. We did have to draw \$40K out of savings to be able to pay our June bills. The end of the 23-24 fiscal year is June 30, THIS Sunday (but we could still back in a gift even if received this week). We are all the sudden having a much better financial year. I will report on everything before too long.

John Adams wrote to his wife Abigail, “the Second Day of July 1776, will be the most memorable Epocha, in the History of America. —I am apt to believe that it will be celebrated, by succeeding Generations, as the great anniversary Festival. It ought to be commemorated, as the Day of Deliverance by solemn Acts of Devotion to God Almighty. It ought to be solemnized with Pomp and Parade, with Shews, Games, Sports, Guns, Bells, Bonfires, and Illuminations from one End of this Continent to the other from this Time forward forever more. ”

I am confident there will be plenty of fireworks locally (and in Seward). I hope there will also be plenty of picnics, parades, and games. We will offer our solemn act of worship in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass (6:20 and 8 a.m.) on the Fourth of July AND will have breakfast after the 8 a.m. Mass in the Didier Room as a special way to bring people together. I will make TWO egg casseroles and coffee and others can bring fruit, kolache, breads, Jaternice or whatever they so choose. All are welcome. Bring your friends and families. Have a Blessed Lord’s Day and a happy and safe 4th of July week.
