

All retreats are open to men or women, except: June 30 and September 23 are women only July 7 and August 11 are men only

Retreats typically begin Friday at 8:00pm with a rosary and Mass, and end on Sunday with Mass and noon lunch. Each retreat includes times for silence, Mass, Eucharistic Adoration, Confession and devotions.

PRIVATE AND SILENT DIRECTED IGNATIAN RETREATS

A typical weekend retreat is a preached retreat to the entire group by a Retreat Master, while the remainder of the time, retreatants enter into silence with God.

In contrast, our **Ignatian Retreats**, listed to the right, also known as **Directed Retreats**, allow each retreatant to meet privately with the retreat director every day.

Based on The Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius of Loyola, the heart of the Ignatian Retreat involves spending four or five prayer periods each day in meditation on scripture, journaling about the prayer times and the movements that occurred, and meeting with a director, to be given spiritual guidance and appropriate meditations.

Ignatian Retreats have both 4-day and 8-day options. At-home Ignatian Retreats with spiritual direction via Zoom are also available. Contact us to inquire about scheduling 4-day, 8-day, and 30-day Directed Ignatian Retreats.

Dear Parishioners:

One year ago, the three of us priests moved into St. Mary's Rectory. As you can see in the picture (ON LINE), one of us is wiser and is able to avoid turning into a ice cream Sundae. We all feel much more settled in and are happy to be serving you as priests in various ways. Please let us know if you have a spiritual or sacramental need we can help you

Two big events this week: Dr. Jo Witter in the Didier Room on Sunday at 6:30 p.m. and on Tuesday at 7 p.m. in the Church, Dr. Vern Steiner will speak about how the Bible led to his conversion to Catholicism. Both very inspiring faith events.

This past week was Totus Tuus. I want to thank the team members, parents and younger clergy (FTS and Deacon) for teaching and hanging around with the students and making sure things went smoothly. I am glad they had good numbers for both daytime and HS evening events.

I am glad to say the roofers came and safely made repairs on the shingles that had blown off this spring in the high winds. It is very high to the crest of the church and they are courageous and talented craftsmen
