Need Spiritual Direction? This last summer, Sr. Mary, MS (Director of Evangelization) completed a three-year program in Spiritual Direction and received a certificate from the Cenacle in Clearwater, Florida (in association with the Franciscan University of Steubenville). Spiritual direction is concerned with developing your relationship with God and in discerning how the Holy Spirit is leading us in your life. It is best done during an ongoing, confidential, one-on-one discussion. Unlike pastoral counseling, which is goal-oriented, Spiritual Direction focuses on the directee's relationship with God, which is not a problem to be solved but a gift to be deepened and better understood. Anyone desiring a deeper prayer life can request spiritual direction. Call the parish office (X4) if you're interested in growing your spiritual life through this means.

Eucharistic Passport Pilgrimage: The National Eucharistic Revival is a movement to restore understanding and devotion to this great mystery here in the United States by helping us renew our worship of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. As part of that, Bishop Conley invites you to join him in traveling across our Catholic Diocese of Lincoln on a "Eucharistic Passport Pilgrimage." Pastor's Corner

Dear St. Mary's Parishioners,

With our fiscal year ending on June 30, 2023, I have attached our budget and the new budget for 23-24. We have had our Finance Committee and Parish Council meetings and have Stewardship coming up this Wednesday. We had a good year in many respects. The main highlights were that we had \$35K more in Sunday collection than budgeted and we paid off

off \$100K to the Diocese on our loan Thank you for this generosity! We were blessed to get a \$100K reduction in our assessment to Aquinas last year and to not have an increase in 23-24. Thanks to the local pastors for making our life more manageable. The bad news is we ended the year \$63K in the red, we still owe the diocese \$80K and Aquinas \$267K and our main checking was \$15K in the red at the end of the year. Now, we are still in a \$0 balance position having paid our August bills with the exception of Aquinas \$67K due in 12 days.

We will be forced to spend down our building/ restoration account. I wish that was not the case. Other options would be some large donations to come or a major gift from an estate to miraculously appear. We already wiped out our St. Mary's DIAL savings account.

This is the challenge of St. Mary's Parish in David City. It has not cashed flowed for many years and is a continual challenge mainly due to our support of Catholic Education. I know the past three pastors felt the pressure and onerous financial challenges and all tried to deal with to the best of their God given abilities. I try to remain positive and focus on the many good things (Faith, community, building and grounds) that I see going on in the parish.

A longer-term solution will be receiving major gifts from Estates of those who love the Catholic faith and parish and are blessed in this life by God in His abundance. We have a lot of very valuable farmland in the area that is very productive and well managed. The wealth that is being handed on to next generations is in record numbers. Unfortunately, we only put \$5K in our Endowment in the past five years.

I am blessed to have Kathy Engel helping me with development for St. Mary's parish. We had two nice visits this past week and we hope to visit with dozens of more parishioners in the year ahead. Our intent is to thank people for their past generosity and to ask for planned and estate gifts.

The only reason we could pay all our bills and pay off the \$100K to the diocese and end with \$52K in the black if you combine the past two years (\$115K in black and \$63K in red) is due to two major estate gifts received about January 2022: Lorray Smith's for \$119K and from Mary Hotovy's for \$63K. This \$182,000 allowed us to manage our expenses. If we could cash flow otherwise, we would have been able to put some or all of this in the Endowment.

I do not like the financial situation we are in. The rule of thumb is to have 3 months of expenses on hand in your bank account which would be about \$300,000. We have \$0 today. I am not blaming anyone, but asking everyone to consider how much God has given to you and how much you give back to God in return. Everyone's situation is as unique as your DNA. How can you (and I) be a better steward of God's gifts. I see many who are remarkable stewards and very generous with their time, talents and treasure and them I am so very grateful. I know that many others could really step up their game. Our Stewardship Campaign in the next few months will hope to improve the situation. May God help us live more fully in a spirit of gratitude for the gift of His Son Jesus Christ, **FBC**
