Pastor's Corner

Dear St. Mary / Assumption Parishioners,

The weather has turned cool and we got a beautiful rain in the middle of the night on Thursday morning of 70 hundreds. I was blessed to do something this week that I haven't done in 18 years – go fishing. My last adventure was to the boundary waters of Northern Minnesota with a BSA troop of about 25 (split in 2) from Cure of Ars parish in Leawood, KS where my high school classmate had two sons in the troop and I got invited as the chaplain. I caught a nice 26 inch northern that sufficed as food and adventure for the week. We canoed over 50 miles (merit badge), camped at four different locations, played cards, sang around the campfires, swam and had fun. I ended up witnessing the marriage of the younger sons two years ago.

A few months ago, Larry Sabata showed me his pond and offered to take me fishing. We kept talking about it and Wednesday, everything aligned for him to knock at the rectory door at 5:30 a.m. with donuts in hand. After some coffee, conversation and sharing of photos, we were off as it was getting light outside. We had light jackets for the chill in the air. He had the boat and fishing gear ready (I forgot mine at last assignment – no I did not leave my golf clubs or tennis rackets). We loaded the boat and jumped in– actually we very carefully boarded as we are not as nimble as we used to be. I thought to ask him if he can swim but was afraid, he may think I had ulterior motives. I did not rock the boat.

As we pushed off, Larry started the trolling motor and within minutes, we had lines in the water. Larry was a good teacher and fisherman. Together we caught six fish (Larry 5, FBC 1). He knew where they were and by the end, I had learned many of the techniques. You had to cast amongst the shore and weeds and let it dangle, jerk the line, keep it low and once you had a nibble, know when to "set the hook" with a swift pull on the fishing rod. I had several get away at various stages. We moved around the whole lake trying different spots and different bait. He was much more skilled at landing the large mouth bass. It was fun, relaxing and I hope to go again.

Of course, I was thinking about the apostles who were fisherman and how their trade helped them become "fishers of men." In bringing people to Christ, we must pray, be Spirit led and be knowledgeable, patient, persistent, resourceful, timely and committed to the task. Just as the fisherman changes up the bait, location and techniques depending on the fish and conditions, so the disciple of Christ needs to adapt to the current opportunities and challenges.

This fall, we kick off the Fall programs (Alpha, Bible studies, OCIA, & CCD), I hope you will consider coming and bringing ONE friend on one of the nights. For Alpha on Tuesday, there is a meal served (no cost), a 30-minute video and then a period for discussion. The program is open to Catholics and non-Catholics. This weekend, we will be handing out little cards to promote Alpha. Pray and think about who you could invite. Like a good fishing day, you will enjoy being a more active member of the Church, even if this is something you haven't done in a long time.
