

Assistant Pastors Corner

Dear St. Mary and Assumption Parishioners:

This week has been such a wonderful reprieve from those chilling temperatures! It feels like spring! Although I know that this a false spring and there is still winter ahead, it has brought a kind of life back into daily living. I have seen many more people out and about walking, playing at the park, or riding bikes during these warm days. This warmth has brought a king of renewal to life.

I have been thinking of the newness that simple things can bring to our lives. As mentioned, the warm weather has brought back the enjoyment of various activities. Fr. Lenten Regulations for the Diocese of Lincoln for 2025:

Ash Wednesday & Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence.

All Fridays in Lent are days of abstinence.

<u>Fasting</u> means eating only one full meal with two smaller meals, which together do not equal the full meal. No snacking or eating between meals is allowed. Fasting obliges all Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59.

Abstinence means eating no meat, and no soup or gravy made from meat. Abstinence obliges all Catholics over the age of 14. Sickness, hard manual labor, pregnancy, etc. automatically excuse a person from these obligations. Nevertheless, it should be pointed out that these are serious obligations. In cases of doubt or question, the priest who hears a person's confession should be consulted.
