We are all excited about the drastically warmer weather coming. 60 degrees warmer on Saturday than Thursday. Like a lot of older people, my love for snow, sub zero and ice is a lot less than when I loved to go sledding down the biggest hill, build forts, skate on the ponds and creeks with pick up hockey games at mirror lake. I was happy to see a kid out building a fort on the parking lot piles.

Many thanks to Tim Prothman for doing such a timely and excellent job of cleaning off the parking lots and walkways around the church. Thanks also to Fr. Schukei for keeping the steps and walkways cleared, not because I told him, but because he likes being outside (getting away from me).

I had the flu from Sunday thru Wed and with a doctor's visit and meds am feeling much better. I was achy and sick of lying around feeling inclined to do nothing, not even eat (that is rare). So, having my health 80% restored has really brought the joy, energy, and love of God back (I know that His love never left but it is sure easier to feel when well).

I read a little meditation in Magnificat for today (Feb 20th) on death that I liked. While I read about death in Scriptures, attend and do a lot of funerals, I cannot say I have read a lot of theology on death. This come from an Austrian poet and theological student who was put to death by the Nazi regime. He wrote "For the peace of the Christian begins only in death.... With the inexpressible bliss of supreme life, which is supreme wakefulness, supreme activity, and supreme intensity, and at the same time deepest calm, deepest peace, and deepest security.... Everything of ours that we give returns to us a hundredfold."

I know that St Thomas Aquinas wrote about death and how we enter a superior state of existence in Heaven. I like how simple and beautiful Hanns George puts it. I think of people who embody this supreme vitality in life and how much more they will experience it in heaven. I think of friends who love golf and want that supreme game, parents who love seeing the supreme state performance, employees shooting for the supreme patent, cure, job performance, surgery, landing of a plane, service at a restaurant, ministry to the sick. And in heaven, we experience it with deep calm, peace and security – no stress, fret anxiety or effort. It is all given according to the receptivity of the deceased.

We are nearing Lent, our annual time of renewal and retreat focused on prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Begin now asking God what you should work on during the 40 days. Think and pray out of the box. How can God direct you into your greatest Lent ever? He will not disappoint you and will give you directions to follow. God bless you as we celebrate the 7th Sunday in Ordinary Time and warmer weather.
