## Assistant Pastor's Corner

Dear St Mary's & Assumption Parishioners,

Happy Thanksgiving weekend. I hope and pray that you are incredibly grateful for God's many blessings. I recently read an article in the **WSJ** about "Thanksgiving shaming" and that some people may not be thankful at this time of the year and that they really cannot enter the holiday with genuine spirit of thankfulness. Moreover, the article said that doing so would hurt their genuine feelings and emotions. It would be extremely hard to be in such a situation that genuine gratitude to God is hard to muster.

On the other hand, I read in *Magnificat* today (Wednesday, Nov 27) about a 19-year-old German boy imprisoned during the holocaust due to his Nazi resistance, who was writing to his mother as he faced death in the coming days. He was thankful for his youthful life, hoping to preserve it, but resigned to accept his fate. In this final letter to his dear Mama, he expressed his love for her and gratitude for all her support, prayers and sacrifices for him throughout his life. It was very touching, courageous, and inspiring.

We can add to our prayers of gratitude the ceasefire between Isreal and Hezbollah after 14 months of war, death, and destruction in the Middle East. God willing it will continue.

I am grateful that Aquinas sent about fifteen students on Tuesday to help work at St Mary's for the morning. Fr. Schukei was chief organizer. He arranged for about five of them to clean the church under the direction of Barb Belsky. Meanwhile, he worked with six outdoors cleaning up the beds and preparing everything for winter. Inside, in the warmth of the basement, I worked with four young ladies painting the hallways and laundry room. FTS and I had it prepared so they could tape, roll, and brush on the paint. I had combined several leftover paint cans into a new color suitable for the laundry room (much better than the original green from 1952). I put the more experienced painters in the hallway, and I did the higher areas. I noticed that when I was painting above the steps, they got a lot chattier. They were a big help and later that day, I finished the touch up and clean up. One more little project checked off the list.

Advent begins this Sunday on December 1<sup>st</sup>. We can all be grateful for the sacrifices our mothers made to bring us into the world. They carried us in utero for nine months and bore the pain of childbirth. They abstained from drugs and alcohol and made many preparations for our entering the world. There was a room or crib prepared for us with blankets and diapers.

As we prepare over the next four weeks for the Birth of our Savior and his coming again at the end of time, let us ask ourselves what sacrifices and penance should we impose to help us spiritually, physically, emotionally for His coming. "I will raise up for David a just shoot, he shall do what is right and just in the land" (first reading from Jeremiah this Sunday). In this city of David, God willing we will truly prepare for his birth.

Have a blessed Advent. God bless you and yours, FBC.

PS We will have our morning of recollection on <u>THIS</u> Sunday December 1st at Appleton. We will have our first Sunday coffee and rolls, then Eucharistic Holy Hour with a talk by both FTS and me. We will then have Benediction before noon.
