Assistant Pastor's Corner

Dear St. Mary and Assumption Parishioners,

Work and Toil, Rest and Sloth. Part 1

God made man to work. He also made us to rest. To our modern ears, these sound like opposites, and only one of them sounds good. We may even be tempted to pick one over the other, as if God were testing us with a riddle. The problem is that our understanding of "Work" is twisted by the effects of sin, as is our understanding of "Rest".

Looking at Genesis chapters 2 and 3, we can see where things should have been and how they turned out. In verse 15, he makes man to be the gardener of the Garden of Eden, "to cultivate and care for it." I don't think I need to convince anyone that caring for a garden takes a good amount of hard work. Work, properly understood, cannot be a bad thing. God is one who works, and He made us to be like Him. But all too often we fall into the trap of turning work into **toil**. When the work we do isn't bearing fruit and so we determine that working harder will produce the fruit that we are looking for, that is toil. A gardener who tries to force a garden to produce might just end up with a dead garden (or dead themselves). Toil is one of the main curses that God gives to man as a result of the sin of Adam and Eve (3:17). God gives this curse for a very simple reason. Adam and Eve had all the food they could want from the bounty of the Garden of Eden. Sure, maintaining the Garden was going to take some work, but God had provided everything necessary for the Garden to thrive. Only when Adam and Eve felt that they needed to take food for themselves, instead of receiving what was already given, did God decree that food would not come easy to us. But that curse isn't so much God changing how things grow, as much as the disastrous effects of Sin on all of

In other words, God wants us to the be co-workers with Him, but when we choose to act on our own, our work becomes toil. The uncertainty of our own ability, the temptation to control every factor, the anger of our work producing little to nothing, all of these are the effects of sin and are all signs of toil. Toiling over anything is frustrating and leads us to a desire to stop working, which is the wrong direction to take.

To toil is to be a slave of the very work we are doing. To prevent our work from becoming toil, we need to always keep God close in our work. To see how He is the one who works to make all things happen, and he wants us to work with him. And part of working with God is resting with Him as well. Because work and rest are not opposites, Toil and rest are. But for now, we'll let this topic rest until the next time.
