Pastors Corner

Dear St Mary's and Assumption Parishioners,

Friday was picking up sticks in David City Park Day. I do not know how well it was advertised but when I saw it at the Wellness Center, I thought "I can do that". I brought my rake, gloves and hat after Mass at the Court. There were only three volunteers. One came up to me with a barrel and said, "my dad always said, only touch them once". It was a good strategy that worked for her. I said, "I don't want to haul that around, it will slow me down." I can be stubborn and opinionated. Both of us were right! Diverse ways of accomplishing the same goal. We worked together and picked up thousands of sticks. Within two hours, we had 2/3 of the park reasonably cleaned up. She had dumped her barrels many times and I had 20 piles of sticks. The city employee came around with his JD gator and we gathered my piles. I felt good to have done some community service and walked 6,000 steps.

It was sad news to hear yesterday afternoon of the shotting of Fr. Carasala, the pastor in Seneca, KS. It reminded me of Fr. Gutgsell who was shot in his rectory in Ft Calhoun, North of Omaha in Dec. 2023. In both cases the assailants were immediately apprehended. We should pray for these priests and the parishes who lost their beloved priests. These are senseless crimes and remind us of the broken (and deranged) world that we live in.

This is our last week before Holy Week. Our Lenten prayers, fasting and almsgiving are being severely tested. We can all strive to have a good end to Lent. While the season ends with the Holy Triduum, our prayer, fasting and almsgiving should extend all the way to Easter (Vigil).

Holy Week is the time in which we celebrate the most sacred events in the life of Jesus Christ. We begin with Palm Sunday, when we celebrate Christ's triumphant entry into Jerusalem riding on a donkey. We recall his Passion and take home a blessed palm.

At the Chrism Mass on Monday at the Cathedral, the Bishop consecrates the Holy Oils for use in our parishes. We renew our commitment as priests, religious and laity to the universal call to holiness. We join with all the priests of the diocese and honor the Jubilarians afterwards with a delicious dinner in the basement of the Cathedral. As a priest of the Diocese of Lincoln, it is one of the most prayerful and enjoyable days in the year.

On Holy Thursday, in the celebration the Mass of the Lord's Supper, we have the washing of the feet of the twelve apostles- an example of service and humility. We commemorate the institution of the Holy Eucharist and the Holy Priesthood. We transition to the Garden of Gethsemane (Parish Hall) for some time of adoration on that holy night. "Could you not stay awake with me for one hour?"

On Good Friday, we celebrate the Lord's Passion. We read the Passion, sing the Universal prayers of the Church, venerate the cross of Christ and we are still able to receive Holy Communion – even though this is the one day when the Mass is not offered.

At the Easter Vigil, after dark we light the Paschal Candle from the Easter Fire, we pierce the darkness with "Christ our Light - Thanks be to God." The flame is passed and illuminates the whole church as we are called to be Light of the World. We sing Exultet, have Old Testament salvation recalled, sing Gloria and triple Alleluia. We are blessed to celebrate the beauty of new life born in Baptisms, Confirmations and First Holy Communions. Christ is alive in our hearts, church, faith, lives, and nature. Easter Sunday, we continue this celebration of the great 50-day season of Resurrection of Jesus Christ.

A blessed remainder of Lent, FBC
