Dear St Mary's and Appleton Parishioners,

As millions in our country follow the sad kidnapping story of Nancy Gutrie, the 84-year-old grandma, who loved her Lord and family, we pray that she will be alive and returned to her family. How heart wrenching the ordeal must be for her children and family and all who knew her.

Tonight, I think of my mother's final illness. She was 85 and went with family to LC's BBQ where she was not impressed with the cleanliness of the place and she came down with influenza. I was able to go to KC to see her after Masses on Sunday despite accumulating snow especially in the KC area.

The trip was a bit longer due to the weather and she called me when I was just getting near to St Luke's Hospital where she was being treated. She left me the most precious voicemail (still have it) about how she was looking forward to seeing me, she could see the heavy snow and was worried about me, and that she loved me. We had a lovely visit, and I said I would come back the next day, and we could have Mass in her room. She asked me to bring a couple things from home for her.

The next day, we had Mass in her hospital room, I anointed her, we visited and she knew I had to get back to the parish and school. She hadn't eaten much and her only request was for a popsicle which I was able to get in the cafeteria. When I left, I thought she would rebound and get back home. However, she went to a nursing home the next day, for three days and then to hospice center. She had chronic asthma and got pneumonia. The next Sunday, while after Masses I wanted to go to KC to see her, I needed to drive to Chicago to my mother's sister Mary Rose Shaughnessy's funeral at St Thomas the Apostle on the southside. In driving across Iowa, I spoke to several brothers and Malachy said, you need to come to KC, mom is dying. I said, I must go have Aunt Rose's funeral. He said, "Can't you get someone from Chicago to do that?" I said I don't know priests in Chicago. I can't be in two places and mom would want me to be there for it. In talking to two other brothers who were already in Chicago and were coming back, I told Keith to tell her I love her and would be with Rose. Rose had died January 22 and my mother had predicted she would die before Rose's funeral (as if it is taking so long to arrange).

I arrived in Chicago, went to Rose's condo, celebrated dinner with a brother, sister and cousins and friends, and I went to bed at the hotel. In the middle of the night, I checked my phone to see many messages to learn she had died at 12:10a.m.

I cried because I really loved my mother and she was the best. Kevin and his family had made it back and had a good visit. Keith got back before midnight. Some say she waited and rallied for Keith (oldest) and he proceeded to tell her all about the buildup for Rose's funeral, when she went home to her Maker. My parents lived in 1210 W. 61st for over 50 years. She often said she wanted to leave that house feet first and she did after collapsing from the weakness of flu and being taken out by paramedics on stretcher.

Sometimes I second guess not going to KC. The reading this weekend focus on the choices we make in life. As a priest, we must leave behind family (even mother and father) and follow Jesus and serve the Lord. We are given the hundred-fold reward in this life and the life to come. God bless you all my brother and sisters in Christ, FBC
