



Dear St. Mary / Assumption Parishioners,

The National Eucharistic Congress is taking place this week in Indianapolis, IN from the 17-21. Speakers include Sister Miriam James Heidland, host of the "Abiding Together" podcast; and Father Josh Johnson, host of the podcast "Ask Father Josh," Bishop Robert Barron; Cardinal-elect Christophe Pierre; Crookston Bishop Andrew Cozzens, who heads the Eucharistic Revival; also the popular face of Ascension Presents and host of the hit "Bible in a Year" podcast, Father Mike Schmitz; Father Agustino Torres, CFR; and author and professor Father John Burns of the Archdiocese of Milwaukee.
